Nine Amazing Fish Facts

These may sound *fishy*, but they are absolutely true.

1. A lobster's teeth are in its stomach.
2. A shrimp's heart is in its head.
3. A horseshoe crab has 10 eyes. They're placed all over its body—even on its tail.
4. You can estimate a fish's age by its scales. You can count the growth rings, just like you'd count the rings on a tree.
5. Fish can get seasick. Keep a fish in a pail of water on a rolling ship, and sooner or later that fish will barf.
6. Fish get dandruff. It's caused by flaking skin (as it is in humans), and there's nothing they can do about it.
7. Some fish can breathe air. Small fish like betas and gouramis have an organ called a labyrinth that lets them breathe fresh air. It allows them to survive in water with low oxygen levels.
8. Fish can talk to each other. Some rasp their teeth or make noises in their throats; other fish use their swim bladders like a horn.
9. Fish can change sex. Boy? Girl? Many fish start out as one sex and turn into the other later on. Some deepwater fish are both sexes all the time. That means they never need to look for a mate to have babies.
